ENROLLMENT

More than 3700 students are enrolled at SCCC. Nearly seventy percent of our students are traditional students who come to SCCC after high school. Most have plans to pursue a four-year degree. The balance of the student population is comprised of returning adults and lifelong learners.

FACULTY

The average class size is 18. We have a dedicated and distinguished faculty of 250. More than thirty percent of the faculty hold doctorates and several have published books, articles and textbooks.

TECHNOLOGY

At SCCC we are committed to providing the latest in technology. A number of computer labs are available on campus as well as wireless networks. All students receive email accounts. Most classrooms are equipped with Smart Boards. Online and hybrid classes are available.

ADMISSIONS

THE UNIVERSITY CENTER

DIRECTIONS AND CAMPUS MAP

FROM THE EAST VIA ROUTE 80: Route 80 West to exit 25; Route 206 North into Newton; Left at light; Bear right onto 206 North; Left at light onto Mill Street; Left at light onto Swartswood Road; First right onto College Hill Road.

FROM THE SOUTH VIA ROUTE 15: Route 15 North to Route 517, Sparta/Franklin exit; Left at light onto Route 517/Newton-Sparta Rd; Follow approximately 5 mi. into Newton; Road changes to Spring Street; Bear right onto Rt 206 North; Left at light onto Mill Street; Left at light onto Swartswood Road; First right onto College Hill Rd.

FROM THE NORTHEAST VIA RT 94: Route 94 South to 206 South to Newton; Right on North Park Drive; Left onto Route 519; Right at light onto Swartswood Road; First right onto College Hill Road.

FROM THE SOUTHEAST VIA RT 94: Route 94 North to Newton; Left at light; Bear right onto 206 North; Left at light onto Mill Street; Left at light onto Swartswood Road; First right onto College Hill Road.
