COVID Information

SCCC Senior Citizen Tuition Waiver

Sussex County residents, 65 years and older, are entitled to free tuition and fees for eligible college-level courses.

These conditions apply:

- The class must be eligible for the senior citizen free tuition (some labs, trade and field experience courses will not be eligible).
- Paid enrollment warrants the course being conducted.
- There must be sufficient space available in the class.
- Registration for the course must occur only during the final two business days before the start of the semester. Applicants who opt to register earlier are not eligible for free tuition. Applicants may take the course for college credit or may choose to audit the course.

Applicants must register in person during the specified registration time and present proof of eligibility. Please contact the SCCC Admissions Office at 973-300-2223 with any questions.
