Instructor Jumana Hablawi presented on the concept of internationalization and its importance.

Internationalization can enhance the quality of education and prepare students to succeed in the global labor market, while fostering open-minded individuals who

care for the world and one another.

The Visual & Performing Arts Dept. collaborated with the Sussex Cty Arts and Heritage Council through a grant made possible by SCAHC. An innovative and interactive children's theater workshop entitled "I Can! We Can!" was offered.

SCCC is supporting the Bihn Collection Project at the Sterling Hill Mining Museum, which features over 4,000 stone artifacts from over 30 sites in Sussex County. Dr. Tony Balzano, Professor of Anthropology & Sociology, is helping to bring the two organizations together for the betterment of the region from an educational and understanding perspective.

## Enrollment & Marketing

Summer Enrollment continues to look strong into FY26. Summer Applications are up about 2% and enrollment is up about 7%.

Fall Enrollment looks solid, thanks in part, to the College's Strategic Enrollment Group, which meets weekly to analyze data and make informed decisions regarding course fill rates, applicant conversion rates, FAFSA completions, and more.

## Information Technology

The IT Dept. is busy with training and data conversion to the new cloud-hosted Jenzabar One, with go-live planned for October 2025.

SCCC is collaborating with Planet Networks on a new fiber connection that will enable the PSTA to integrate into the College network fully.

IT has installed 30 additional grant-funded All-In-One workstations for faculty and staff that were not upgraded with the last AIO group purchase.

The IT Dept. is moving equipment to and from storage and network connection additions for the renovation of the C Building, the cafeteria, and the Learning Commons project. They are also working with Dr. Homer for network services on other building projects, including
